Spice Up Summer Reading



Here are a few ideas to spice up summer reading. The links after each idea offer practical steps to accomplish each one. Do take a minute to explore one or two that catches your eye!

- 1. Visit the **local library.** Find a quiet corner and read a stack of new books together.
- 2. Learn how and when the **bookmobile** was invented and reinvented. (Hint: Elkhart, IN! <u>Library Bookmobile</u>)
- 3. Build a **blanket tent** and read with a flashlight or book light. (*Getting Kids to Read under the Covers*)
- 4. Act out a storybook. (5 Books for Kids to Act Out after Reading)
- 5. Make **puppets** to retell a story. (inexpensive used Amazon book: *How to Make Puppets with Children*)
- 6. Listen to an **audio book** together while traveling. (I loved the Secret Garden or The Chronicles of Narnia!)
- 7. Read a **book** and then watch the **movie** version. (Here's a great list: 100 Best Movies Based on Books for kids)
- 8. After reading a favorite book, **write the author** (via the publisher). (*How to Write to an Author*)
- 9. Host a **kids' book club**. (This article has suggested books by grade level! (*How to Start Book Clubs for Kids*)
- 10. Make a **mini-poster** with a favorite quote from Winnie the Pooh or Charlotte's Web. (*3 Ways to Make a Poster* OR use the Canva app on your phone!)

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
